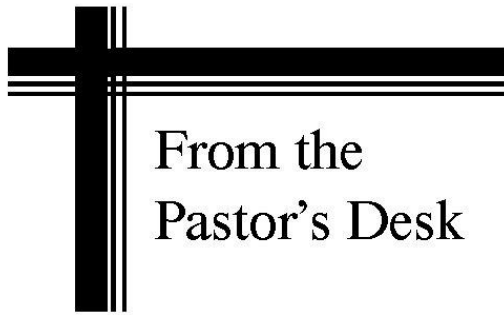

This week, October 22nd, will be the Sorrowful Mysteries and on October 29th the Glorious Mysteries. Everyone is encouraged to attend.

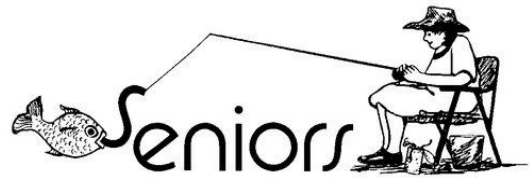

ANOINTING of the SICK

There are times when we still think of this sacrament as being only for those who are dying. The Second Vatican Council asks us to reflect on Jesus and his desire to help all who suffered and His concern involved more than just bodily illnesses. Today we have the opportunity to receive this sacrament both individually and in a community celebration. Our sickness/our need may be a bodily illness, an addition, depression caused by a variety of sources, as well as spiritual and mental illness. We now have the opportunity to bring our pain, our fear, to the healing and comforting touch of Christ in this Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This Sacrament is a celebration of faith, an expression of who we are before God. We are more than just our physical being. We are the Body of Christ. In this sacrament we pray that the sick be healed in body, in soul and in spirit. God alone knows what kind of healing we need most: that a wound be healed; that a fear turn to confidence; that loneliness be embraced by the support of a praying community; that confusion in the face of all the whys – why me, why suffering, why now – turn to insight. The Sacrament does not remove the mystery of human suffering. Its celebration gives us a window into the mystery of a loving God.

Join us next Saturday, October 26th at 1 pm in the church for our parish celebration of the Anointing of the Sick.
