Solemnity of All Saints – Nov. 1

A common commemoration of the Saints, especially martyrs, appeared in various areas throughout the early Church. In 609, the Emperor Phocas gave the Pantheon in Rome to Pope Boniface IV, who rededicated it on May 13 under the title of St. Mary and All Martyrs. The designation of November 1st as the Solemnity of All Saints occurred over time. Pope Gregory IV asked King Louis the Pious (778-840) to proclaim November 1st as All Saints Day throughout the Holy Roman Empire. Eventually, Pope Gregory IV (827-844) officially declared November 1st the Solemnity of All Saints.

Commemoration of All Souls – Nov. 2 Along with the Solemnity of All Saints developed the Commemoration of All Souls. The Church has consistently encouraged the offering of prayers and Mass for the souls of the faithful departed in Purgatory. Around 1030, St. Odilo, the Abbot of Cluny, France decreed for all of the Cluniac monasteries that special prayers be offered and the Office of the Dead be sung for all of the souls in Purgatory on November 2, the day after All Saints. The Benedictines and Carthusians adopted that same devotion and soon November 2 was adopted as the Commemoration of All Souls for the whole Church.

ALL SOULS DAY MASS REMEMBRANCE

Monday, November 2nd is All Souls Day. Please remember to return your All Souls envelope by November 1st, so that your intentions can be placed on the altar on All Souls Day.

All Souls Day Masses will be celebrated at 8:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. on Monday, November 2nd.

The names of all those who have died this passed year will be read at the Masses on All Souls Day.
