



Saint Patrick Feast Day - March 17th

Patrick was born in 385 in Roman Britannia in the modern-day town of Dumbarton, Scotland. At the age of 16 he was captured by barbarian Irish pirates who took him inland and forced him to work as a farm laborer and shepherd. He suffered greatly at their hands. During his enslavement, Patrick's Christian faith galvanized and served to sustain him during the dark years of captivity. After 6 years of imprisonment, Patrick had a dream in which he was shown an escape route to freedom. He successfully broke free from his captors and eventually traveled back to his homeland. There, he committed to his faith in earnest and became a priest. He felt tremendous mercy toward the people who kidnapped him. So he returned to Ireland with a mission of seeing pagan Ireland converted. The gospel drove Patrick to return to his oppressors that he might devote his life to their peaceful conversion and the cause of their salvation.

COVID VACCCINE INFORMATION

York College is now open to all residents of Queens! "In order to be vaccinated at this location, you must be a resident of Queens and provide proof of residency within Queens. Individuals must either (1) provide one of the following: State or government-issued ID; consulate ID (if New York address is displayed); Statement from landlord; Current rent receipt or lease; Mortgage records; or (2) provide two of the following: Statement from another person; Current mail; School records. Individuals being vaccinated must bring proof of eligibility to the vaccination site and complete the NYS Vaccine Form before arriving. Proof of Eligibility includes both identification and proof of occupation (unless age 65 or greater, or attesting to having a comorbidity), if you have insurance, please bring your information with you to your appointment." https://am-i-eligible.covid19vaccine.health.ny.gov/ C.

<u>Saint Joseph</u> Patron of the Universal Church, unborn children, fathers, workers, travelers, immigrants and a happy death. Feast Days: March 19th and May 1st

Everything we know about Joseph comes from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. We know he was a carpenter, a working man. "Is this not the carpenter's son?" (Matthew 13:55) We know he wasn't rich because he offered the sacrifice of 2 turtle doves or 2 pigeons when Jesus was presented to the Temple for circumcision. These sacrificial animals were allowed for those who could not afford a lamb. (Luke 2:24)

Though Luke and Matthew disagree on some details of Joseph's genealogy, they both agree Joseph ascended from David, the greatest king of Israel. (Matthew 1:1-16; Luke 3:23-38) We know Joseph was a compassionate, caring man. When he was betrothed to Mary and found out she was pregnant, he resolved to send her away quietly and **not** expose her to shame or cruelty. When an angel told him to flee Egypt, he did so **without question**. These are actions of a truly compassionate and caring man.

We know Joseph loved Jesus and his one concern was for Jesus' safety. This was reflected in the anxiety of Mary and Joseph when they searched 3 days looking for Him. Joseph treated Jesus as his own son. Repeatedly in Scripture we read, "Is this not the son of Joseph?" Joseph respected God. He took his family every year to Jerusalem for Passover and followed Jewish law and traditions.

Joseph does not appear in Jesus public life, at His death or resurrection. Therefore, many historians believe Joseph probably died before Jesus entered public ministry. There is so much we do not know about Joseph but Scripture give us the most important information... he was a "righteous man." (Matthew 1:18) He was formally canonized in 1870 by Pope Pius IX and declared Patron of the Universal Church.

Saint Joseph, pray for us.
