

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY - APRIL 24th

Devotion to the Divine Mercy is an authentic spiritual movement within the Catholic Church, promoted by Sister Faustina Kowalska, who was canonized April 30, 2000. Pope John Paul II announced: "Throughout the world, the Second Sunday of Easter will be given the name Divine Mercy Sunday."

Faustina Kowalska was born in the rural village of Giogowiec, Poland on August 5, 1905. At 20, she was admitted to the convent of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Warsaw. For the next 13 years, she carried out humble tasks as cook, gardener and porter. She died in Krakow on October 5, 1938.

While living her hidden, humble life, she began to be favored with the mystical experience of the Divine Mercy. She received visions, revelations and hidden stigmata (the wounds of Jesus) and, at the suggestion of her spiritual director, began to write about these experiences in her diary in 1934.

Her spiritual legacy to the Church is devotion to the Divine Mercy, inspired by a vision in which Jesus Himself asked that a portrait be painted of Him with the inscription, "Jesus I trust in You," which she commissioned to a painter in 1935.

In the painting, two rays of light shine forth from the chest of Jesus. The bluish white light symbolizes the waters of Baptism, and the red light symbolizes His Most Precious Blood and the Holy Eucharist.

Sister Faustina's diary entitled "Divine Mercy in My Soul," revealed how Our Lord entrusted her with the mission to proclaim to the world once again, the evangelical message of His mercy and to establish new ways of devotion to God in his attribute of mercy for all, especially those in greatest need.

"I will pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy." From the Diary of St. Faustina, "Divine Mercy in My Soul"

Sacred Heart Parish will celebrate a Holy Hour from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. on Sunday April 24th. During the Holy Hour, there will be the Solemn Chanting of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, recitation of the Litany of Divine Mercy and Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament. All are welcome!

WHAT TO DO WITH OLD SACRAMENTALS

When your rosary breaks or your crucifix falls apart, what to do? What should

be done with these holy objects?

Sacramentals are sacred signs and provide for us grace (spiritual help) through the intercession of the Church. They can be any number of religious items that have been blessed by a priest or deacon — a rosary, medal, scapular, crucifix, or even a candle.

Catholics are instructed to dispose of old sacramentals in a way that shows due reverence. All sacramentals can be either burned and buried or buried as they are in order to properly dispose of them. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to the earth in a dignified way. If a person is unable to do either, the sacramental may be dropped off at the rectory and someone on staff can take care of it.

By treating sacramentals with respect, we recognize & honor the heavenly blessing that was placed on the object.

Should you wish to dispose of palms blessed on Palm Sunday they should also be disposed of in the same way – you may bury them or burn them and spread the ashes outside.
