


#### BEREAVEMENT FOR PET LOSS MINISTRY

#### Our Lady of Good Help <u>Anniversary of the Apparition October 9</u>

In early October 1859, the Blessed Mother visited a young woman in Robinsonville (modern-day Champion), Wisconsin. Now known as Our Lady of Good Help, this apparition was declared "Worthy of belief" in 2010, becoming the only Marian apparition in the United States to be approved by the Church. Today the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help stands on the site. Here is the story:

In early October 1859, Adele Brisa, a 28 year old Belgian immigrant, was carrying a sack of wheat to the local grist mill. She saw a woman, dressed in white, who was surrounded by light and had a crown of stars around her head. A few days later, Adele saw the woman again. Uncertain of what to do, she sought the advice of her pastor. He told her to ask the woman, "In the Name of God who are you, and what do you wish of me?" The following day, Adele saw the woman and asked her the question. The woman replied,

I am the Queen of Heaven, who prays for the conversion of sinners, and I wish you to do the same. You received Holy Communion this morning, and that is well. But you must do more. Make a general confession and offer Communion for the conversion of sinners. If they do not convert and do penance, my Son will be obliged to punish them. Mary further told her, "Gather the children in this wild country and teach them what they should know for salvation."

Specifically, she asked Adele to teach children their catechism, the Sign of the Cross, and how to approach the Sacraments. Mary said, "Go and fear nothing. I will help you." In response, Adele's father built a simple chapel on the apparition site and Adel spent years traveling throughout a 50 mile radius to instruct children. She eventually opened a school and formed a community of Third Order Franciscans. On October 8, 1871, several fires threatened the Midwest due to drought and strong winds. This included the Great Chicago Fire and the Pishtigo Fire - the deadliest wildfire in recorded history. The fires threatened lives and millions of acres. Determined to stay at the apparition site, Adele asked the faithful to process around the chapel with a statue of Mary. They prayed throughout the night until the early hours of October 9<sup>th</sup> which was the 12<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Mary's final apparition. It started to rain, and the fire stopped just before reaching the chapel grounds. The flames were so close that the chapel's fence was burned on the outside but untouched on the inside. The only livestock to survive were the cattle the farmers led to the chapel. While many deep wells in the area went dry, the chapel's shallow well gave the cattle enough water to survive the heat. Adele spent the rest of her life teaching children about the Church. She died on July 5, 1896 and is buried on the grounds of the National Shrine.
