Today is Father's Day and how blessed we are to honor our father, living or deceased, with a special Mass remembrance at all the Masses. For many if not for all of us we treasure many happy and blessed remembrances of our fathers—taking us to the park or to the beach, teaching us how to whistle and how important it is to say "thank you." Two of my favorite memories of my Dad are when he showed me how to tie a tie and when he taught me how to bless myself when I began to pray. May the following reflection encourage us to pray for our fathers and to offer thanks to God for the gift of fatherhood.

"When God Made Fathers"

When the Good Lord was creating fathers, He started with a tall frame. And a female angel nearby said, "What kind of father is that? If you're going to make children so close to the ground, why have you put fathers up so high? He won't be able to shoot marbles without kneeling, tuck a child in bed without bending, or even kiss a child without a lot of stooping".

And God smiled and said, "Yes, he needs to kneel and be humble, and besides, if I make him childsize, who would the children have to look up to?

And when God made a father's hand, they were large and sinewy. And the angel shook her head sadly and said, "Do you know what you're doing? Large hands are clumsy. They can't manage diaper pins, small buttons, rubber bands on pony tails or even remove splinters caused by baseball bats."

And then God molded long, slim legs and broad shoulders. And the angel nearby was alarmed. "Boy, this is the end of the week, alright, she clucked. Do you realize you just made a father who has no lap? How is he going to pull the child close to him without the kid falling between his legs?"

And God smiled and said, "A mother needs a lap. A father needs strong shoulders to pull a sled and balance a boy on a bicycle, or to hold up the head of sleeping daughter on the way home from a day at the circus."

God was in the middle of creating two of the largest feet anyone had ever seen when the angel could contain herself no longer. "Do you honestly think those large boats are going to dig out of bed early in the morning when the baby cries? Or walk through a small birthday party without crushing at least three of the guests?"

And God smiled saying, "They'll work you'll see. They'll support a small child who wants to ride a horse or scare off mice at the summer cabin. He'll wear shoes that will be a challenge to fill."

God worked throughout the night, giving the father few words, but a firm authoritative voice, eyes that saw everything, yet remained calm and tolerant. Finally... almost as an afterthought, God added tears. Then he turned to the angel and said, "Now, are you satisfied he can love as much as a mother?"

This Sunday the Church celebrates The Most Holy Trinity and Father's Day! Trinity Sunday asks us to reflect on the mystery of God as one God in three persons: Father, Son FORMATION and Holy Spirit. The Church also celebrates Fatherhood and their role

in both families and the Church.

Grade/Level 7 confirmation interviews concluded this past week. We remind all our Grade/Level 7 candidates that their Grade/Level 8 registration forms and fees must be submitted no later than June 30th in order to join us for Confirmation in 2026. Confirmation Candidate Information forms will be mailed out to families once all Grade/Level 8 registrations have been finalized.

Report cards were mailed out this week to students in Faith Formation grades 1, 3-7 who successfully completed their coursework. Anyone not completing and passing all of their assessments will be invited back to repeat their grade level.

In-person registration began this past week in the Faith Formation office. On-line registration begins on Monday, June 16th. Any child new to our program must provide a copy of the child's baptismal certificate to enroll in our program. Any transfers into our program must provide a letter of transfer from their previous program including sacrament information and proof of the sacraments. Any child reregistering in our program must have successfully competed their prior year's work.

We thank our Faith Formation catechists for their help this past school year in working with our families to further along the knowledge of God in each domestic Church! We look forward to seeing our catechists return for the 2025-2026 school year!

The shamrock or clover can be used to represent the Blessed Trinity, one God in three Persons. Look in the mirror to find a prayer to the Trinity.







Today we celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Trinity. The word Trinity is a title for God that tells us that He is three Persons in one God.

Before Jesus came, the people didn't know that God was a Trinity. The Israelites knew that there was only one God, but they didn't know very much about Him. Jesus showed the people that there were three Persons in God when He taught them about Himself and the Father and the Holy Spirit.

The three Persons in the Blessed Trinity are all equal but different. We cannot understand this, but we believe it because Jesus taught it. It is one of the Mysteries of our Faith.

What does the Holy Trinity do for us? We know that God the Father made everything and we are intended to go back to Him. The Holy Spirit guides us towards Him, and Jesus is the way.
