

Did you know that for his first visit outside the Vatican, Pope Leo XIV, visited the image of Our Lady of Good Counsel in Genazzano, Italy?

Our Lady of Good Counsel is important because this title emphasizes the Blessed Virgin Mary's role in being both a spiritu-

al director and a model of faith and perseverance.

Why is this image considered miraculous? Tradition tells us that during the Ottoman offensive in 1467 the sanctuary of a church in Scutari, Albania, was reduced to ruins. But, on the one remaining wall was a fresco of Our Lady of Good Counsel which then seemed to disappear. The same year in Genazzano, Italy, in a Church dedicated to Our Lady of Good Counsel, people heard beautiful music coming from a cloud above the church (many people at the time testified to this) - the cloud descended on the church hovering above the wall of an unfinished chapel. When the cloud disappeared it revealed the image of a Madonna and her child on a paperthin sheet of plaster 18 inches square which was floating unsupported in mid-air. Miraculously the bells in the Church began to ring and then were joined by all the bells in the town which also began to miraculously ring. So, the image that disappeared in Albania just before the invasion of the Ottomans then miraculously appeared in Italy in a Church of the same name at the same time!

A local priest at the time recorded over 160 miracles following the appearance of the image – miracles that included healings, answered prayers, and dramatic conversions. For over 550 years the image has attracted countless pilgrims. (Much of the Church was destroyed in WWII but the image stayed intact. Today it is said by observers to still float inside the frame it is housed in on display in the church in Italy.) Our Lady of Good Counsel pray for us!

Faith Formation Reminders:

Any child new to our program must provide a copy of the child's baptismal certificate to enroll. For any child joining us from another religious education program, a letter of transfer is required. Any child re-registering in our program must have successfully completed their prior year's work. Attending Mass during the summer months helps children continue their spiritual formation so please don't neglect weekly Mass attendance!





Loving God and Our Neighbour

In today's Gospel reading we learn that the greatest commandment is to love God with all our heart and soul and strength, and to love our neighbour as ourselves.
