Litany of the Saints

IN THE Litany of the Saints, the Catholic Church calls upon dozens of saints by name to join in a solemn petition to God. The litany is used on occasions of special importance, such as the Baptism of adults; the dedication of a church; the ordination of a deacon, priest or bishop; and the prayers for the dying. The litany is always prayed at the Easter Vigil, even if there are no Baptisms. An abbreviated litany precedes the Baptism of infants.

The litany took shape throughout the Middle Ages. It probably began as a processional song in which the people repeated a simple refrain to a series of invocations intoned by cantors. The litany was standardized in 1570 and underwent a few minor revisions after the Second Vatican Council. It is usually sung in the traditional way—one or two cantors alternating with everyone else.

The litany begins by calling on Christ to have mercy. Then the saints are asked to pray on behalf of the Church on earth. The saints are arranged in chronological groups. First, the saints who appear in the Bible are named (e.g., Mary, the angels, and some apostles), and then some early martyrs, including Ignatius of Antioch, Lawrence the deacon, and Agnes. Then appear the great doctors of the church, such as Gregory and Augustine. Those associated with monasticism or the founding of religious orders come next—saints such as Martin, Benedict, and Francis. The list concludes with more recent saints, such as Catherine of Siena and Térèse of the Child Jesus.

The litany then asks God to save people from various evils by the life of Christ. It concludes with intentions relating to the event at hand.



Did you know...August 2nd is the Feast day of Our Lady under the title, Queen of the Angels. This title was beloved by Saint Francis of Assisi because it was the name of the little ruined chapel he thought God commanded him to

rebuild. Called the Portiuncula, "little portion," this chapel is visited by pilgrims from around the world each year.

In the 18th century, Spanish Franciscans also honored Mary by naming one of their mission settlements in what is now California for her. It was called, "El Pueblo de la Reyna de los Angeles" (The Town of the Queen of the Angels). Today the city is known as Los Angeles.







In today's Gospel reading, a man tells Jesus that his brother is being unfair to him. But Jesus knows that the man is just being greedy, so He tells him the

parable of the rich farmer. One year he had such a good harvest that he couldn't fit it all into his barns. He tore down his old barns and built new ones, so that he could store his food for many years. But just when he thought he would be able to rest and enjoy his food, God told him that he would die.

This parable is a warning against being greedy. Jesus is not saying that we should not save some food or that we shouldn't save our money. He wants us to use the things we have wisely, but not be too attached to them.

Think of something that is really special to you. How would you feel if you lost it or it was taken away? Do your feelings show that you care too much about things? Try to think of your belongings in such a way that if you lost them you wouldn't be too upset. After all, none of your stuff is going to matter to you when you die!
