





The sick came for healing and some of his cures were considered miraculous.

Online registration and re-registration is required for all students who wish to continue in our program. Registration and re-registration for Grades/levels 1-7 is available through the Faith Formation web-




When we are proud we think that we are more important than other people, and that we deserve to have better things. We start to look down on everyone else, and pretty soon we start thinking that God isn't so great either!
