



Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever been on a pilgrimage? Many times when we hear about pilgrimages we think of the Holy Land visiting "where Jesus walked." In Italy, Spain, France and other places, pilgrims go to different holy shrines and pray in cathedrals and churches. A pilgrimage can last a number of days or even one day.



According to "Daily Bread," a pilgrimage is a journey that pilgrims make to a place that is considered holy. A pilgrimage is more than just traveling to historic sites and viewing religious relics. It is a journey with a deeper and more spiritual meaning.

The word pilgrim comes from the Latin word "peregrinum" which conveys the idea of wandering over a distance. A pilgrimage is not purposeless wandering. It is a journey with a higher purpose and that purpose is to honor God.

One of the earliest uses of the word can be found in works of Saint Augustine of Hippo. In his text, "Peregrinatio," he described a Christian spiritual journey as a self-imposed exile of the pilgrim in which he searched for God's truth.


Pilgrimages are steeped in religious history. It all started around 957 BC when the temple was built at Jerusalem and because of this all Jewish men were obliged to present themselves there for major feasts. After the death and resurrection of Jesus and the spread of Christianity, Christians were inspired to follow the footsteps of their Savior, the Holy Mother and the Apostles. Pilgrimages became a significant part of the Catholic tradition in the 4th century when Christians traveled to different places that were part of Jesus' life or in the tombs of martyrs and saints.

A pilgrimage has moral and spiritual significance to the pilgrim. Generally, it involves embarking on a journey to a shrine or site that the pilgrim considers important in light of his faith and religious convictions. There is much to see, discover and learn from visits to these religious locations. There is also a rich, inner transformation that can be had from a pilgrimage. A pilgrimage lets us plan and immerse ourselves in the cultural, historical and spiritual aspects of the life of Jesus and the saints.

I invite you to make a pilgrimage to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday, October 25^{tth}. I look forward to being with fellow pilgrims from our three parishes of Sacred Heart, St. Pancras and St. Margaret celebrating Mass with Bishop Brennan and all the faithful from our Diocese. What a blessing to be a pilgrim in this special year of the Church- "Pilgrims of Hope!"



The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. October 7th was the day in 1571 when Catholic forces defeated an invading Turkish fleet in the Battle of Lepanto. Pope Saint Pius V, a Dominican priest, had asked the faithful to pray the Rosary for victory, which kept Christian Europe from falling under Islamic

law. The Pope attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Mother. According to tradition, the Rosary devotion began when Our Lady appeared to Saint Dominic and revealed how the Rosary was to be prayed as a meditation on the life of Christ. The original fifteen mysteries of the Rosary were grouped into the Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries. In 2002, Pope Saint John Paul II added the Luminous Mysteries.

October 18th is the Feast Day of Saint Luke the Evangelist. He is one of the four traditionally ascribed authors of the canonical gospels. The Early Church Fathers ascribed to him authorship of both the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. St Luke is often depicted in Christian art as an Ox because his gospel focuses on the sacrificial character of Christ's death. The Ox has always been considered a sacrificial animal. This imagery of St. Luke can be seen on the ceiling mural in Sacred Heart Church.




