As mentioned last week, October 18th is the Feast Day of Saint Luke the Evangelist. St. Luke worked closely with St. Paul to spread the Good news. He is the only Gospel writer to describe the Annunciation and the Visitation. He also provided a detailed description of the Nativi-

ty. Tradition tells us that St Luke knew

the Blessed Mother well and that she herself told him much of what he later recounted. Another tradition tells us that St. Luke painted an image of Mary on top of a table constructed by Christ himself! St. Luke is often depicted in Christian art as an Ox because his gospel focuses on the sacrificial character of Christ's death. The Ox has always been considered a sacrificial animal. This imagery of St. Luke can be seen on the ceiling mural in Sacred Heart Church.

October 22nd is the feast day of Saint John Paul II who often spoke of St. Luke and his crucial witness to the Gospel. Saint John Paul II wrote that St. Luke focused on the themes of Divine Mercy, the role of the Holy Spirit, Mary being a model of faith, and Luke's Gospel concludes with Christ's mission mandate of discipleship.
